VOTE ON ACCOUNT FOR 2021-22

Introduction

Vote on Account for 2021-2022

- 1. This document seeks a Vote on Account for the Parliamentary Works Sponsor Body ("the Sponsor Body") as required by the Parliamentary Buildings (Restoration and Renewal) Act 2019, which established the Sponsor Body to take responsibility for the Parliamentary building works (as defined in the Act).
- 2. The Vote on Account provides resources and cash to allow existing services to continue during the early months of the coming financial year, pending Parliament's consideration of the Main Supply Estimates for 2021-22. 'Existing services' means services for which Parliament has given approval before 31 March 2021. Statutory authority for the issue of a sum from the Consolidated Fund equal to the Vote on Account will be sought in the Supply and Appropriation (Anticipated and Adjustments) Bill.
- 3. The Main Supply Estimates for 2021-22 will be presented around April 2021. Parliament authorises the provision sought when the Supply and Appropriation (Main Estimates) Act is passed.
- 4. The Parliamentary Works Estimates Commission are responsible for approving its Vote on Account and Main Supply Estimate for 2021-22, and the House of Commons Administration are responsible for the laying of this document before Parliament on the Commission's behalf. Whilst it is recognised that the Sponsor Body is not part of the House of Commons Administration, for the purposes of this Vote on Account, the principles contained within section 7(3) of the Supply and Appropriation (Main Estimates) Act 2020 have also been applied here.

Amounts required

- 5. The amounts in the Vote on Account are normally a standard 45 per cent of the amounts already voted for the corresponding services in the current year. This should normally be sufficient to ensure that the provision made for each service is not exhausted before the Supply and Appropriation (Main Estimates) Act is passed in the summer, but not so high as to prejudge Parliament's consideration of the Main Supply Estimate.
- 6. A Vote on Account provision outside the standard 45 per cent may be sought when:
 - a. it is possible to anticipate a change in the structure of a Supply Estimate;
 - b. consumption of resources or expenditure of cash during the early months of the financial year is expected to be significantly different from the standard.
- 7. As 2020-21 was the inaugural year in which a Vote on Account and Main Supply Estimate was sought for the Sponsor Body, the current year provision is based on the anticipated expenditure proposed for 2021-22 as submitted to the Parliamentary Works Estimate Commission. The Main Estimate for 2020-21 was only for the first 3 months or operations and so has not been used for this calculation.
- 8. The Vote on Account in respect of Central Government Supply is anticipated to be presented today by the Financial Secretary to the Treasury. A Vote on Account for the National Audit Office, Electoral Commission, House of Commons: Administration, Independent Parliamentary Standards Authority and the Local Government Boundary Commission for England is expected to be presented to Parliament at around the same time.
