

Sustainability Policy

Purpose

The R&R Programme is responsible for delivering the Parliamentary building works (the "Programme") as set out in the Restoration and Renewal Act 2019. The purpose of this policy is to ensure that Sustainability is a primary consideration on the Programme and to establish the environmental, social and economic principles that support the Programme Vision, Strategic Themes and Goals.

The R&R Programme will seek certification to Environmental Management ISO14001 which includes a commitment to pollution prevention and enhancing environmental performance. BREEAM Very Good standard will be achieved as a minimum on all projects. Performance will be regularly monitored, reviewed, measured and reported to support continuous improvement.

All Sustainability policies will comply with the legal requirements that relate to the Programme as a minimum. This policy will be reviewed regularly to ensure it remains effective and will be communicated and made available to interested parties and the supply chain.
